Class Environmental Assessment and Preliminary Design
Neighbourhood Meeting September 9, 2010

Dear Resident:

As you are aware, the City is currently completing the Class Environmental Assessment and Preliminary Design for widening Sarnia Road, from Wonderland Road North to Sleightholme Avenue. Public Information Centres (PIC) were held March 9 and June 1, 2010, with the recommended design presented at the second PIC for public input.

At and following the June 1 PIC, we received comments from several residents concerned about the recommendation to limit the Sarnia Road/Leyton Crescent intersection to right-in/right-out. In addition, a petition was received requesting full access be maintained at the intersection.

As presented at the PIC, the recommendation to limit Leyton Crescent to right-in/right-out is based on a number of factors including, safety of the travelling public and compatibility with other planned improvements in the corridor.

After reviewing all of the comments received and meeting with local Emergency Services Providers, the recommended design was revised to permit emergency services full access at the intersection, with left turns continuing to be restricted for the travelling public.

Based on the number of comments received following the PIC related to the proposed changes at Leyton Crescent, we are planning to hold a neighbourhood meeting to review all of the alternatives considered and to address the concerns that have been raised to date. The meeting will be focused on proposed changes to the Leyton Crescent as well as Castlegrove Boulevard (west leg) intersection.
