

# Ward 6 Survey Responses

## Background

The survey distributed by Councillor Phil Squire regarding strategic and multi-year budget priorities yielded 68 responses from constituents in Ward 6. Respondents were asked to rank the program or service listed from 1-5 (one being their first choice and 5 being their last choice). The programs/services included: 1) expand transit services, including rapid transit, 2) increase London's tree canopy through increased tree planting and conservation methods, 3) increase London's waste diversion program including a green bin program, 4) implement London's downtown plan, and 5) other, please specify.

## Results

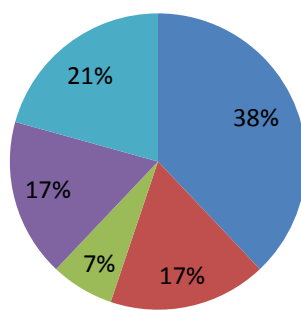
Out of the 68 responses, the number one program/service the constituents of Ward 6 wanted to see implemented was to expand transit services. This response was ranked first 22 times, or 38%. The implementation of London's downtown plan was ranked as the second most important; 21 times, or 33%. London's waste diversion program and green bins yielded the least number of results, not being a chart topper in any of the rankings. The consolidated ranking results are below:

A little over half of the total number of respondents chose to record an "other" response. The most common "other" response was concerning park enhancement and development, specifically Sherwood Forest Park. This category was mentioned eight times. The second and third most popular "other" response was road maintenance (mentioned 7 times) and by-law enforcement and re-evaluation (mentioned 6 times). Another common response pertained to student and rental housing concerns. This was brought up in 5 "other" responses.
